Day 1: Departure

Today our group embarks on a journey to the Holy Land. Prepare yourself for a life-changing experience. Make sure to get some rest on the flight because soon you will be walking where our Savior walked!

Day 2: Arrive Amman, Jordan

Welcome to Jordan! We arrive in Amman, where we will meet our guide and travel to our hotel for a good night's rest.

Day 3: Jerash, Mt. Nebo, Madaba, Travel to Petra

Today, we will journey to Jerash, known for its grand colonnades and ancient theaters. It represents the region where Jesus' ministry reached beyond Jewish communities. Jerash is one of the ten cities of the Decapolis mentioned in the Bible. Next, we head to Mt. Nebo, believed to be the site of the tomb of Moses, for a spectacular view across the Jordan Valley and the Dead Sea. We will study the panorama as we read the Scripture, showing Moses the "Promised Land" before He brought him home to heaven. We will have an opportunity to visit the famous mosaic map of the Holy Land in Madaba before heading to our hotel for the night. Our day ends in Petra, where we will enjoy dinner and spend the night.

Day 4: Petra, Dead Sea

Our day begins at the amazing mountain fortress of Petra. This is known to be inhabited by the Edomites, the descendants of Esau. We will walk through the "Siq," an immense crack in the Nabatean sandstone, to the city of Petra, carved out of the rose-red rock. The Treasury, El Khazneh, is one of the most elegant remains of antiquity. Beyond El Khazneh, we are surrounded on both sides by hundreds of Petra's carved and built structures. Then we will drive to the Dead Sea, where we will enjoy a delicious dinner and spend the night.

Day 5: Baptismal Site, John the Baptist's Cave

Recognized as the place "beyond the Jordan where John was baptizing" (John 1:28), Bethany Beyond the Jordan is widely accepted as the historic location of Jesus' baptism by John the Baptist. This sacred site features ancient baptismal pools, ruins of early churches. Just east of the river lies John the Baptist's Cave, traditionally believed to be a place where John lived, taught, and prepared the way for the ministry of Jesus. Together, these locations offer a profound connection to the beginnings of the Gospel narrative, where themes of repentance, renewal, and the revelation of Christ's identity come vividly to life. Today, we have some free time to

float on the Dead Sea and rest with friends and prepare to continue a wonderful journey together!

Day 6: Allenby Bridge into Israel, Beit-Shean, Gideon's Spring, Yardenit, Magdala

Today, we will cross into Israel via the Allenby Bridge and journey north to Beit-Shean, an impressive ancient city where Saul and his sons were hung on the city walls after the battle on Mount Gilboa (1 Samuel 31). Continue to Gideon's Spring, the waters where Gideon's men were chosen for battle (Judges 7). From there, travel to Yardenit on the Jordan River, a beautiful location for baptismal reflection, and conclude your day in Magdala, the hometown of Mary Magdalene, where a first-century synagogue and village bring the world of Jesus' Galilee to life.

Day 7: Caesarea Philippi, Dan Nature Reserve, Mt. Bental, Golan Heights, Chorazin

Your journey continues with a visit to Caesarea Philippi, where Peter proclaimed Jesus as the Messiah, followed by the lush Dan Nature Reserve, home to ancient Israelite ruins and biblical high places. Travel on to Mount Bental in the Golan Heights for panoramic views that highlight the region's strategic and historical significance, and conclude at Chorazin, one of the Galilean towns Jesus addressed, known for its well-preserved basalt synagogue and village ruins.

Day 8: Mt. of Beatitudes, Capernaum, Tabgha, & Sea of Galilee Boat Ride

Our day begins with a devotional at the Mount of Beatitudes, where Jesus gave His inspiring Sermon on the Mount. Next, we tour Capernaum, where Jesus did most of His miracles, and the home of the Apostle Peter. Then we will enjoy St. Peter's fish for lunch before a relaxing cruise on the Sea of Galilee and reflect on the miracles which confirmed Jesus is God the Son. We will close our day at the Ginosar boat museum before returning to our hotel for dinner and a good night's rest.

Day 9: Nazareth Village, Nazareth Precipice, Mt. Carmel, Caesarea, Mt Scopus

We begin our day with a drive to Nazareth to visit the Nazareth Village, a remarkable reconstruction of first-century life that brings the childhood home of Jesus into vivid focus. We will visit the Nazareth Precipice, traditionally associated with the cliff from which Jesus was threatened after teaching in the synagogue (Luke 4). We travel onward with a drive through the Jezreel Valley, where the battle of Armageddon will take place, before ascending Mount Carmel, where Elijah confronted the prophets of Baal (1 Kings 18). We conclude our journey at the Mediterranean city of Caesarea, built by Herod the Great and visited by Peter and Paul. We will finish the day with the beautiful overlook from Mount Scopus, offering sweeping views of Jerusalem as the Holy City welcomes you.

Day 10: Masada, Jerusalem

Our day begins with a drive to Masada, where we will take a cable car ride to the mountain top fortress.

Here, our guide will share with us the history behind the famous zealots' last stand. Afterwards, we will head back for some free time to explore Jerusalem.

Day 11: Mount of Olives, Palm Sunday Road, Garden of Gethsemane, Church of All Nations, Caiaphas' House, City of David, Hezekiah's Tunnel, Pool of Siloam

Our day begins atop the Mount of Olives, taking in the iconic panorama of Jerusalem before walking down the Palm Sunday Road, retracing the path of Jesus' triumphal entry. Continue to the Garden of Gethsemane and the Church of All Nations, where the night of Jesus' agony and prayer comes vividly to life. Visit Caiaphas' House (St. Peter's Gallicantu), traditionally linked to Jesus' trial and Peter's denial, before exploring the ancient layers of the City of David. From there, walk through Hezekiah's Tunnel—or the dry Canaanite tunnel—for a firsthand encounter with biblical history, and conclude at the Pool of Siloam, where Jesus sent the blind man to wash and receive his sight (John 9).

Day 12: Bethlehem's Shepherd's Fields, Israel Museum, Yad Vashem

This special day in Jerusalem begins in Bethlehem's Shepherd's Fields, where angels first announced the birth of the Savior to humble shepherds, inviting reflection on God's faithfulness and the humility of Christ's coming into the world. From there, the journey continues to the Israel Museum, where important biblical-era artifacts and the Shrine of the Book help link the stories of


Scripture to real places, people, and events in history. The day concludes at Yad Vashem, Israel's Holocaust memorial, whose name is drawn from Isaiah 56:5 and which soberly remembers the six million Jews who perished, calling visitors to honor the image of God in every person and to stand against hatred and injustice in every generation.

Day 13: Western Wall, Western Wall tunnels, Southern steps, Temple Institute, Pool of Bethesda, St. Anne's Church, Via Dolorosa, Church of the Holy Sepulcher, Garden Tomb


Our last full day in Jerusalem traces key moments of the Bible's story of redemption, beginning (if permitted) on the Temple Mount and at the Western Wall, where pilgrims remember God's presence in the Temple and lift prayers at the holiest site in Judaism. From the Western Wall tunnels and Southern Steps—where Jesus likely taught—to the Temple Institute's vision of a future Temple, the setting brings Scripture's past and prophetic themes into sharp focus. Continuing to the Pool of Bethesda and St. Anne's Church recalls Jesus' healing power and the grace that restores both body and soul. Walking the Via Dolorosa toward the Church of the Holy Sepulcher, then visiting the Garden Tomb, helps visitors meditate on Christ's suffering, death, and resurrection, often culminating with a meaningful time of communion celebrating the risen Lord.

Day 14: Home

This morning, we transfer to the Tel Aviv Airport for an early-morning flight and enjoy the memories of an amazing journey to the Holy Land.
